Fun facts about the historic Cummings Center site, formerly known as "The Shoe"

In 1910, United Shoe Machinery Corporation's factory staff grew from 3,000 to 4,500, and its workweek was cut from 55 to 50 hours. The company reportedly paid its workers the highest average wages in the country, with common stock worth \$70 million by 1911. Modernization efforts contributed to its great success, as it converted more and more hand operations to mechanical processes.
