Shoe Snippets

Fun facts about the historic Cummings Center site, formerly known as "The Shoe"

In an early employee engagement initiative, United Shoe recognized the importance of providing small luxuries for its employees. Among the amenities available to all employees were a clubhouse, athletic fields, shooting ranges, and gardening plots. Although non-employees were allowed to join the clubhouse, 75 percent of the membership was reserved for factory workers. Three hundred acres was more land than The Shoe needed for its business operations, so it allowed employees to utilize the surrounding farmland free of charge to plant gardens. Workers were permitted to seek assistance from agriculturists in this endeavor, but were responsible for paying for the services provided to ensure that they felt they were paying their own way.
