**Fowl Play:** Please don't feed the birds. A growing population of geese, ducks, and occasionally, two great blue herons, have made Cummings Center "home," perhaps due to the seemingly unlimited supply of food from well-intentioned people. While the birds can be cute and fun to watch, feeding them can be harmful to their health and can also attract unwanted pests and vermin. Massachusetts Division of Fisheries and Wildlife warns that feeding encourages birds to stay in one place and build up flocks that a habitat cannot support. For these reasons, it is very much in the birds' best interest for people to stop feeding them.
