**Make Your Voice Heard:** Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT) and MBTA are establishing an Employer Panel to solicit ongoing feedback from the greater Boston business community about its transportation needs. The information gathered will be used for planning purposes

at MassDOT and MBTA and will be collected via periodic survey. Cummings leasing clients are invited to each designate a representative to <u>participate in the survey</u>, which will take approximately 10 minutes to complete no more than once per month.

**Don't Be Alarmed:** Required fire alarm system testing will take place throughout Cummings Center and Dunham Ridge according to the schedule below. Testing will start at approximately 6:20 AM and warming alarms and
